Weston Aqueduct

Welcome to the Weston Aqueduct walking trail.

This property is a passive trail that has been permitted for use from the Massachusetts Water Resources Authority to the Town of Framingham Parks & Recreation Department.

The Town of Framingham and the MWRA would like to thank you for visiting the Weston Aqueduct walking trail. We ask that you observe the following while using this trail;

- Passive activity only (e.g.: walking, jogging, or bicycling). All other uses are prohibited.
- All users are responsible to assess their own abilities and physical limitations prior to entering the property.
- Activity is restricted to the apex (top) of the aqueduct, the use of all other land is considered trespassing and is prohibited.
- Trail is open Dawn Dusk.
- Alcohol is prohibited.
- Motorized vehicles are prohibited.
- All dogs must be leashed. Remove all pet waste.
- Do not litter. This is a carry-in, carry-out facility.
- Please look for the 'Aqueduct Trails' markers along the trail to find your GPS location.
